

#### **BFA PROGRAM**

#### BACHELOR OF FINE ARTS: ACTING

AMDA's BFA Acting program offers a wide range of performance training for stage, film, and television. The intense eight-term curriculum combines performance-based immersion in craft and technique with well-rounded and engaging academic studies. This program also provides numerous opportunities for onstage production and performance experience throughout the eight terms of study. Early coursework provides for imaginative and creative exploration while developing the vocal and physical techniques necessary for the professional actor. Training then broadens to include script analysis, dramatic theory, various historical periods, and relevant performance media. Supplemental course offerings such as stage combat, improvisation, dialects, and dance and movement, provide actors with an even broader range of potential career opportunities. General Education courses increase the actors' understanding of their worlds, their critical reasoning and their abilities to express themselves effectively as educated and informed artists and citizens. Advanced course work in classical text, period styles, and contemporary theatrical trends help expand the actor's depth of knowledge, skill, and confidence. With an eye towards the current competitive demands of the industry, courses in career preparation, networking, audition techniques, and entrepreneurship help prepare for an exciting transition into the professional performing arts industry. The final term includes an original showcase opportunity that provides a unique production experience built upon the strengths of each performer.

#### AOS PROGRAM

#### ASSOCIATE OF OCCUPATIONAL STUDIES: ACTING

AMDA's Associate of Occupational Studies (AOS) in Acting prepares students for working in theatre, television, and film. This immersive four-term program is built upon performance-based courses in acting, voice, and movement to help actors develop a strong connected physical presence while creating characters with rich imaginative inner lives. The AOS program is enriched with various opportunities for onstage performance experience offered throughout the four terms of study. Classwork explores diverse techniques and styles as applied for use on stage and screen. Voice production and speech coursework, as well as specialized training in improvisation, stage combat, and other movement-based skill sets, provides a wide range of tools for creating three dimensional fully realized characters. Professional preparation is further complemented by classes relating to the "Business of the Business." These address the rigors of branding, marketing, and auditioning as students prepare to enter the world as a working actor. AOS Acting students, as part of their program completion and career launch strategy, will also perform in a special culminating showcase

#### **CERTIFICATE PROGRAM**

#### CONSERVATORY CERTIFICATE: THE STUDIO PROGRAM -ACTING FOR STAGE, FILM, AND TELEVISION

The Studio Program is a rigorous four-term practicedriven curriculum designed to prepare students for a career as a working actor. Students will learn the essential concepts and techniques of effective movement, vocal control, and character development. Training begins with a focus on the actor's imagination and an exploration of his or her inner resources as they relate to the external demands of the craft. Students are then quickly challenged to apply learned techniques — such as composing a visual and vocal score — to portray rich, believable characters. In the final term, coursework is focused on industry and career preparation, including an original showcase production experience. Each showcase is crafted based on the unique and individual cast members assigned as a company. This specialized fourth-term curriculum prepares actors to enter the performing industry with skill, confidence and a professional work ethic.



#### **Program of Study**

#### Requirements

The MFA in Directing program is a terminal degree based on nine quarters of full-time study, with a minimum course of three classes each quarter. Students in the program are expected to complete all coursework for the degree in three years, with up to two additional years to complete the written thesis and the accompanying oral defense.

The program focuses on three categories of core study: Artistic Collaboration, Theatrical Storytelling, and Theater History and Context. Through these lenses, we seek to develop:

- Foundational knowledge from which the director develops a fuller body of practice, including text analysis, aesthetic styles, and the historical and cultural function of theatre
- A developed and articulated point of view that sets a production apart and which is informed by a text's political, social, cultural, and historical implications

#### Application packet

Every applicant must apply formally **on-line through the Graduate School**. Formal applications for Directing require three letters of recommendation from people who know your work as a student and/or theatre artist. In addition, a digital directing portfolio packet is to be uploaded in the Supplemental Materials section in CollegeNET. The deadline for applications is December 15. Portfolio packets should contain:

- A one-page statement of purpose, explaining your current goals, career plans, and reasons for selecting theatre as a major field of graduate study.
- Documentation of theatre work, i.e., reviews, portfolio designs, promotional materials, directing statements, or production photos.
- Official TOEFL scores for international applicants whose native language is not English. The Educational Testing Service will send official scores directly to Northwestern University's Graduate School. Use the

We prioritize each artist's role and opportunity in a professional community.

- Understand and define the work they want to make
- Develop their collaborations with other artists
- Explore their practice in a rigorously informed historical and critical context
- Articulate what they believe theatre should do in the world
- Build relationships with audiences and communities



## Our Plans for 2020-21 and Beyond

Yale School of Drama and Yale Repertory Theatre will not produce seasons of plays in 2020–21, due to the ongoing incompatibility of theatrical production with best public health practices in response to COVID-19. Practical production work is a central tenet of the School's conservatory training; the three-year MFA program is being extended temporarily to a fourth year to best meet and overcome the current and inevitable future disruptions of the pandemic. Similarly, the one-year Technical Internship program will be extended by one semester. The School's next student recruitment cycle will be for admission in the fall of 2022.
