## GENERAL EDUCATION LANGUAGE REQUIREMENT

This requirement may be satisfied by:

1. Successfully completing a third-semester college-level course in a language other than English;
2. Successful completion, in high school, of the third year of a language other than English; or
3. Demonstrating proficiency at the third semester level in a language proficiency examination approved by the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences and the appropriate department.

Generally, one year of high school language study is equivalent to one semester of college study.

## PRACTICUM CREDITS

Our theaters are also our classrooms: we consider our venues to be hands-on laboratories for student learning, with mentoring provided by faculty. Each student - on average - is engaged in one practicum assignment each semester and therefore receives academic credit for their production activities. The Lighting Design & Technology program supports an average of 14 productions each academic year in the genres of theatre, dance, opera, and musicals as programmed by the Departments of Theatre and Dance, and the School of Music. These practicum assignments allow our students to explore both design and technology as stage crew, follow spot operators, lighting console programmers and operators, assistant lighting designers, head electricians, and lighting designers. Some examples are noted below.

THEA 100	PRACTICUM I	Stage Crew Assignment, Ex: Follow Spot Operator, Deck, or Wardrobe position
THEA 200	PRACTICUM II	Production Assignment, Ex: Assistant LD, Assistant HE, or Programmer
THEA 300	PRACTICUM III	Production Assignment, Ex: Lighting Designer, Assistant LD, or Head Electrician
THEA 400	PRACTICUM IV	Production Assignment, Ex: Lighting Designer (LD), or Head Electrician (HE)
